Some monsoonal moisture may return for the latter half of the week with some afternoon clouds near the mountains with small chances for afternoon thunderstorms at times near the mountains.

WEATHER SYNOPSIS BY REGION

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

***** Monsoon Thunderstorms Possible Late Thursday and Friday *****

For the next week or so low pressure will be west of the Pacific NW and northern CA and strong high pressure will be centered over the Desert SW. The low pressure area will have more impact on the region for another couple of days.

W-NW winds will increase again this afternoon through the coastal range and over the higher terrain in the east. By late afternoon gusts to 20-30 mph will spread through the gaps and passes of the coastal mountains and into the western Sacramento Valley. Some spots from the Cascade-Sierra crest east will see SW-W gusts reach 25 mph or so this afternoon. Minimum Relative Humidity (RH) values will be 7-17% in the driest interior areas. These conditions will be repeated each day through Thursday while a warming trend takes place. By Wednesday or Thursday temperatures will be 5-8 degrees above normal. There is a chance that monsoon moisture could move northward and produce thunderstorms late Thursday and Friday. This situation will be watched very closely.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

*****Strong westerly winds across the desert passes through this evening*****

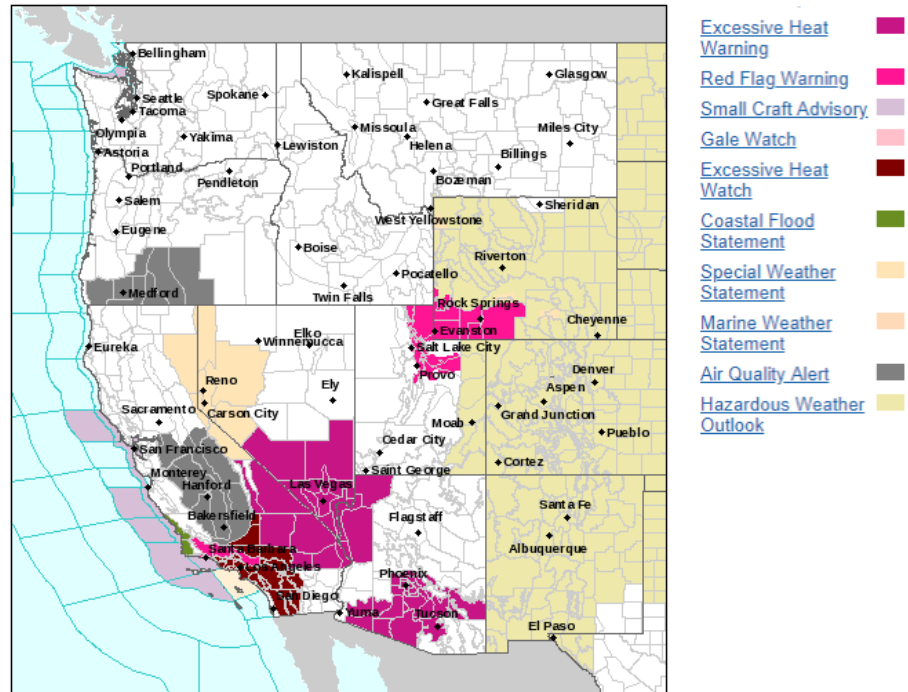
*****Gusty northerly nighttime winds over Santa Barbara County and the Grapevine through Monday*****

There will be little change in the weather today as our region remains in between a weak Pacific trough over Northern California and a strong high pressure area over the Desert Southwest. West winds of 20 to 30 mph with gusts to 50 mph will surface across the desert passes through this evening. North nighttime winds of 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 40 mph will surface across much of Santa Barbara County and the Grapevine through Monday. Temperatures will be near to a little above normal, with upper 70s and 80s across the mountains and 90s to 102 in the valleys. Minimum humidity will be mainly in the single digits and teens away from the coastal areas. The strong high pressure area over the Desert Southwest will expand westward into Southern California bringing a significant increase in temperature Monday. Maximum temperatures will be in the mid 80s to mid 90s across the mountains and upper 90s to 110 in the valleys. Tuesday looks to be the hottest day across Southern California and Wednesday will be the hottest day across Central California during the next week. It will cool a little late this week as the high moves into Nevada, but widespread triple digit heat is expected to continue across interior lower elevations. Minimum humidity will remain in the single digits and teens away from the coastal areas through Tuesday. Humidity will increase across Southern California starting Wednesday and over the Sierra starting Thursday. There will be no change in the very dry conditions across Central California west of the Sierra through the end of this week. Isolated to scattered afternoon showers and wet thunderstorms will form over the mountains and higher deserts of Southern California east of I-15 Wednesday through Saturday and over the Sierra Crest and Northern Deserts Thursday through Saturday.

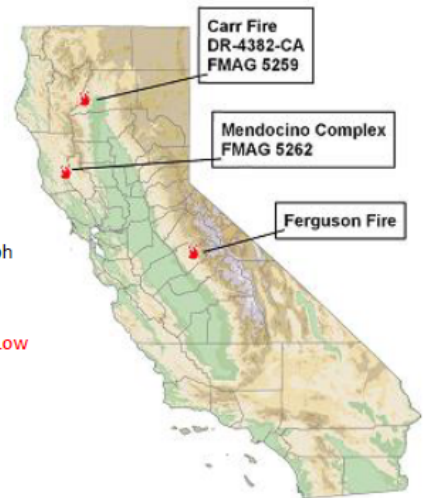

Carr Fire, Shasta

- Known school damages:
 - **Whiskeytown Environmental School**
An environmental education center on National Park Service property, operated by the Shasta County Office of Education that has damaged outbuildings – full extent of damage unknown. Summer camps at the facility have been cancelled through 8/10/18.
 - **Shasta Union Elementary School**
 - All playgrounds are destroyed
 - Portable classrooms on the north side sustained damage to roof and walls
 - Solar field is destroyed
 - Garage with custodian truck and lawn equipment destroyed
 - Garden and greenhouse destroyed
- Other known concerns:

- A majority of schools have concerns about air quality and cleanup of toxic ash

Schools Summary

- Most schools are on summer break and will start the 2018-19 school year in mid to late August
 - The beginning of the school year will be postponed to 8/22/18 for Lakeport Unified School District
- Most schools in the impacted areas operate on a traditional school calendar
- The CDE Communications Director is coordinating efforts with the Cal OES Public Information Officer
- CDE outreach:
 - Daily communication exchanges are under way with affected County Superintendents
- A joint webinar for impacted county offices of education and school districts are being planned for 8/8/18, to disseminate information regarding recovery resources. Details will be forthcoming
 - The CDE expects school districts to make final decisions about any changes to school year start dates by 8/8/18

- Individual Assistance (IA) FEMA declaration was declared on 8/4/18 for the Carr Fire, Shasta County. IA FEMA declaration could bring in grant programs like Individuals and Households Program, Crisis Counseling, Critical Needs assistance program, Transitional Sheltering Assistance, Disaster Case Management, Disaster Legal Services, USDA/CDSS CalFresh (D-SNAP), including the State Supplemental Grant Program, which is administered through State of California, Department of Social Services.
- FEMA will deploy Disaster Survivor Assistance Teams for outreach and assistance in registering people the next 48 hours.
- Working with state agencies and Shasta County on providing names for the FEMA State Agreement to allow those authorized agents to get Personal Identifying Information (PII) to help with IA recovery efforts.

Local Assistance Centers

- IA is encouraging partners to ensure information and services are accessible to all clients who come into the LAC, including those with language and other access and functional needs. The LAC has language support services available in Arabic, Cantonese, Mandarin, Farsi, French, ASL, and Spanish.
- Cal OES, SBA and County are in discussion on details for the upcoming Disaster Response Center(s). FEMA has identified a potential sight for DRC that will open no later than Thursday, 8/9/18.
- Fliers for FEMA registration have been provided to the LAC to hand out, FEMA DSA Teams will be at the LAC in the next 48 hours to help with registration.
- IA is supporting Lake County in preliminary coordination efforts for the opening of a LAC by 8/10/18.
