Northern California

Wind Advisory in effect through 1200 hrs Sunday for western Sierra foothills and slope. Winds will be east to northeast with gusts up to 35 mph in the valley and 35-50 mph in the mountains and foothills.

*Red Flag Warning in effect through Monday.

Southern California

Wind Advisory in effect Sunday for southeastern desert. High Wind Warning in effect Sunday for southeastern desert. Winds will be east to northeast with gusts up to 45-60 mph over higher ridges and through passes and canyons.

*Red Flag Warnings are in effect for through Tuesday for most areas.

High Wind Warning & Wind Advisory in effect Sunday through Tuesday for much of the coastal areas.

Outlook for Sunday / Monday: Critical fire weather conditions are expected through Tuesday for Southern California with gusty winds and low humidity. Red Flag Warnings remain in effect through Tuesday. Local gusts from 50-70 mph and single digit humidities are possible. For Northern California, Red Flag Warnings expire at 0700hrs Monday. Winds will decrease throughout the day Monday but will remain dry.

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CA-ESF 1: TRANSPORTATION

LEAD AGENCY: DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (CALTRANS)

- CalTrans has crews in the field conducting damage assessments. Will begin repairs as Cal Fire allows.

Critical Infrastructure

Camp Fire, Butte County

- Threat to power lines and communication towers, including Saw Mill Peak and Flea Mountain lookouts.
- PSC towers in fire footprint along with PG&E 60 KV, WAPA 230 KV lines and PG&E substations to include Poe, Paradise, Big Bend, Clard Rd, and Centerville substations. Of concern if winds shift to blow in a South Easterly direction would be DWR Oroville assets, PG&E 230 KV line, and the town of Oroville and surrounding area.

Hill Fire, Ventura County

- PSC towers in the fire footprint along with SCE 220 KV lines and Camarillo Substation. State Critical Infrastructure not currently within the fire perimeter, but very near to the fire lines.

Woolsey Fire, Ventura and Los Angeles County

- SCE 66KV sub-transmission lines and Hwy 101. Of particular interest is communications fiber line, which has been severed in the fire footprint hampering internet and cell phone coverage.
- PSC towers in fire footprint along with SCE 66 KV. SR1 closed 8 miles south of Oxnard to 6.7 miles south of Oxnard.

- Boil water advisory issued for Paradise Irrigation District, Paradise Pines, Lime Saddle, Magalia, Stirling Bluffs, Big Bend Mobile Home Park, Grand Mutual Water Co, Blue Oak Terrace.
- Paradise Irrigation District treatment plant was evacuated on 11/09/2018 at 0500hrs. Plant was left running to maintain water pressure for fire suppression.
- Del Oro Water Company in Magalia has been evacuated. Plant was pulling water from Paradise Pines and believed to be functioning. Cal EPA is coordinating with SWRCB to acquire generators for the affected water systems.

Volunteering and monetary donations messaging is up and financial institutions that have set up funds for the wildfire recovery are listed. This information is being updated regularly.
