WEATHER SUMMARY

Northern California

Dry conditions with smoke locked in the valley affecting air quality and visibility will persist. Daytime relative humidities 10-25%. Winds will remain 5 to 10 mph over the next few days.

Southern California

Elevated fire conditions will continue Thursday. Winds will decrease, but remain breezy in wind prone canyons of Ventura and LA County. Extremely low RH values will continue through Thursday, with minimum humidities in the single digits to lower teens.



Northern California

Valley

Temp Highs: 62-72°, Lows: 35-45°
Humidity: 15-25% Day, 65-80% Night
Winds: NE/E 5-10 mph winds.

Foothills/Mountains

Temp Highs: 55-65°, Lows: 15-45°
Humidity: 15-25% Day, 20-60% Night
Winds: NE/E 4-8 mph winds with isolated gusts to 15 mph after midnight.

Southern California

Coast

Temp Highs: 70-80°, Lows: 45-60°
Humidity: 5-25% Day, 10-60% Night
Winds: E/NE 10-15 mph, with local gusts to 35 mph gradually decreasing after noon.

Inland

Temp Highs: 60-80°, Lows: 40-50°
Mtns Highs: 55-65°, Lows: 25-35°
Humidity: 5-15% Day, 15-30% Night
Winds: N/NE 10-15 mph with local gusts up to 30 mph gradually decreasing after noon.

Outlook for Friday/Saturday: Light onshore winds are expected Friday across the state, with gusts to 20 mph possible across SoCal. The change in wind direction will allow relative humidity to increase along the coast. Similar conditions are expected on Saturday.

The first chance of precipitation still looks to be sometime around or after Thanksgiving, with low confidence on exact timing. Precipitation with this first weather system looks light, with no high intensity, short duration rain events to trigger debris flows. However, light rain will impact any tent or outdoor shelter locations.
